# Editorial

In 1986, following the detection of the first AIDS case in the country, the National AIDS Committee was constituted in the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. As the epidemic spread, need was felt for a nationwide programme and an organisation to steer the programme. Therefore, in 1992, India's first National AIDS Control Programme (NACP; 1992-1999) was launched and National AIDS Control Organisation (NACO) was constituted to implement the programme. As we have now stepped in to the 4th phase of NACP, which was launched in the FY 2013-2014, the focus continues to be scaling-up existing facilities.

2013-2014 was an eventful year for Nagaland State AIDS Control Society (NSACS) because of various milestones reached. Within a year, 22 out of 27 Opioid Substitution Therapy (OST) Centres for, injecting drug users, were opened under Targeted Intervention (TI). More information about OST is given under the Targeted Intervention section.

Multimedia campaign, especially the music component, which is targeted to the urban youth, received better response than the previous years in terms of educational institutions visited where quality intervention could be achieved. The successful implementation of the campaign opened the door for NSACS to represent NACO at the first International Communication Management Conference which was held at the Mudra Institute of Communication,

Ahmedabad (MICA). The herculean task of successfully putting together such a campaign by involving all the stakeholders right from the legislators, district administration to the community level could be shared on an international platform.

There was a change of Project Director in NSACS. It was taken over by Dr. Watikala from Dr. N.L Changkija. We will remain ever grateful to Dr. Changkija for not only being an excellent leader but also a visionary and mentor. The trust that she had on the team, her unbiased way of functioning and unwavering loyalty to the program will always be remembered with utmost respect.

Through this newsletter, we hope people across the spectrum; the community at the grassroots level and policy makers at the highest will get to know, in a gist, of Nagaland's effort and role in combating the pandemic of HIV through various programs and activities.

We hope you continue to send your feedback to us because we value them. We have acted on your feedback to add a list of acronyms frequently used. It has been added in the last section of the magazine.



# Sexually Transmitted Infection

To provide quality standardized STI & RTI services at all levels of health system through convergence with NRHM and the Private Sector.

Sexually Transmitted Infections and Reproductive Tract Infections (STIs/RTIs) are important public health problems in the country. The prevention, control and management of STI/RTI are a well recognized cost effective strategy for controlling the spread of HIV/AIDS in the country as well as to reduce reproductive morbidity among sexually active population.

Individuals with STI/RTI have a significantly higher chance of acquiring and transmitting HIV. The emergence of HIV and identification of STIs as a co-factor have further lent a sense of urgency for formulating a programmatic response to address this important public health problem.




Considering that the HIV epidemic in India is still largely concentrated in the core groups, prevention and control of sexually transmitted infections can be an effective intervention to reverse the HIV epidemic progress. The vision of STI/RTI control and prevention program during NACP IV is to provide quality standardized STI/RTI services at all levels of health system through convergence with NHM and Private Sector, focusing women, adolescents and marginalized population.

With the objective to expand health care facility in the State, NSACS established one new Designated STI/RTI Clinic (DSRC) "Suraksha Clinic" at Police Referral Hospital, Chumukedima, which was officially launched on 4<sup>th</sup> September 2013 with Shri Bendang Lemtor (DIG) as the Chief Guest. The launching programme was attended by Police Officials along with Medical Consultant, PHQ, Project Director, NSACS along with officers and staff of NSACS, CMO, doctors and staffs of the Police Referral Hospital, Chumukidema, DAPCU Dimapur and NGO functionaries.


The State is in the process of initiating Public Private Partnership (PPP) on STI with Private Nursing Homes for more coverage of the activity.

District level STI Campaign was successfully launched at Peren District with the initiative of DAPCU on 24th April 2013 in collaboration with District Administration and District Health Authority.

#### **REVIEW MEETINGS**

A regular review meeting of ART centres within the state is held every quarter. All centres make presentations as per the templateprovided. The Regional Coordinator, NERO-NACO/ Joint Director (CST) at Nagaland State AIDS Control Society ensures proper organization of meeting, documentation and follow up action on the issues raised during the meeting.

#### SENSITIZATION PROGRAM **OF HCP**

A Sensitization Programme of Healthcare Providers (HCP) on Universal Work Precautions (UWP) and Post Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) was rolled out. A total of 81 HCP were trained from the districts of Dimapur & Kohima. These trainings were conducted by the institutions where the




# Targeted Intervention


Targeted Intervention (TI) is being implemented as part of prevention activity for High Risk Groups, such as Injecting Drug Users (IDU), Female Injecting Drug User (FIDU), Men having Sex with Men (MSM) and Female Sex Workers (FSW). TI projects also covers bridge population, such as, Truckers and Migrants.

Activities carried out by TI - division NSACS include trainings and review meetings and on-field supportive handholding of project implementation.







# **Opioid Substitution** Therapy (OST)

Opioid Substitution Therapy involves replacing the client's primary drug of use (opioid) with a medically safe drug or the same opioid in a safer mode of administration under medical supervision. In OST, an opioid, which is unsafe, requiring repeated administration which is long acting, and safer, and administered through oral or

OST program was earlier implemented by NGOs and later the Government of India took over the program. In Nagaland, OST District Hospitals (DH), Community Health Centres (CHC) and Primary Health Centre (PHC).

#### ADVOCACY-SENSITIZATION

A programme for 164 Infantry Bn (TA) (H&H) NAGA, Jakhama, an initiative of NSACS, was organised by DAPCU Kohima on the 23rd of Oct 2013 at Jakhama. Basics of HIV/AIDS, STI and Condom Promotion were shared and the participants were motivated to avail free testing services offered by NSACS. HIV related stigma, its impact and consequences on a PLHIV were also shared. After the program, testing was conducted by the MICTC. A total of 35 jawans came forward for testing. Resource persons were Mr Lanu, Kekhrie Foundation; Mrs Azonuo , Mobile ICTC and Dr. Partha, Kripa Foundation.

### DISCRIMINATION RESPONSE TEAM (DRT)


DAPCU Peren formed DRT to address the issues of Discrimination faced by the PLHIVs in the district. The need was discussed and the team formed during the DAPCC meeting in September 2013. A core committee consisting of the ADC, SP and Judicial Magistrate and all other DAPCC members are included as members of the DRT.

#### SPECIAL AWARENESS PROGRAM

DAPCU Peren conducted an awareness program cum HIV testing at Operation Salvage, Heningkunglwa on 23rd November 2013. Operation Salvage is a rehabilitation centre managed by NSCN-IM and home for many drug addicts and alcoholics from across the state and beyond, who stay for months and keep returning. It is a place with a regular in flow of inmates. A total of 35 inmates, the youngest of who was 20 years old, attended the program. Along with the inmates, the chaplain and counselor of Operation Salvage were present during the program. The program initiated by DAPCU, was a joint venture of DAPCU and Mobile ICTC.

#### HIV PROGRAM FOR FACILITY STAFF

DAPCU Peren conducted a program with the HIV facility staff in Peren district, on the 13th of April, 2013 at the Chief Medical Officer's conference hall, to acknowledge some staff for their contributions and achievements, and also with the purpose to encourage other staffs to work harder.

In the financial year of 2013-14, NSACS conducted three DAPCU review meetings at the office of NSACS with the participation of all Program Officers of each NACP components.



**BREATHE IN...LIFE**

A documentary film on Blood Donation by Ossar Jamir, Pixel Craft Design Studio.

This film explores and promotes the blood donation scenario in Nagaland. It tries to give an informative description of facts and figures, promote voluntary blood donation and its health benefits and allay the myths surrounding blood donation. The key message is about Life and its Gift: the ability of our blood.



EYE OF THE STORM

A docu-drama on basics of HIV & AIDS by Ossar Jamir, Pixel Craft Design Studio.

A film based and enacted on a true life story of a Naga woman. In a heart rendering docu-dramatised sequence, it talks about her grief, the discrimination and triumphs, as she struggles to come to terms and live with the virus. The documentary focuses and compounds on the understanding of HIV and AIDS.

#### **IF ONLY**

A docu-drama on Prevention from Parent to Child Transmission (PPTCT) by Imnasenla, Imchen's Productions.

The film relates the story of a mother who feels remorse for the death of her baby; she regrets if only she had known her HIV status, she could have access the treatment to safe her baby. Her hope is renewed after visiting the service centre and getting to know about PPTCT. The film is interspersed with drama, song, interviews and narration.

#### NO MORE DENIALS

A documentary film on Opioid Substitution Therapy (OST) by Atanu Phukhan, Saramati Communications.

The film shares the success story of OST project in Nagaland; to contain the spread of HIV among the Injecting Drug Users. The film is intermingled with life testimonies of recovering drug addicts, interview of service providers, and narration- supported by relevant visuals.



#### TOGETHER WE CAN

A documentary film on the Role of Faith Based Organizations (FBOs) in HIV Prevention, Care & Support by Vikeyielienuo Chielie, Hornbill Productions.

The film highlights the constructive role of faith based organizations towards the People Living with HIV. It captures the exemplary stories of some FBOs that are supporting the PLHIV in different ways.

#### **ON THE EDGES**

A documentary film on Targeted Intervention among the HRGs by Kivini Shohe, Rivers Rock Communications.

The film captures heartfelt life testimonies of people who are 'Men having Sex with Men', female sex workers and 'Injecting Drug Users'. The film also reflects the success stories, the efforts and commitment of NGOs and Government, in working for, and providing services to the High Risk Groups, to prevent the spread of HIV.

A docu-drama on substance abuse and its effects by Temsurenla.




#### AGENTS OF CHANGE

# GREATER INVOLVEMENT OF PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS

Greater Involvement of People Living with HIV/AIDS (GIPA) principles aim to realize the rights and responsibilities of PLHIV to self determination and meaningful participation in decision making processes. GIPA enhances the quality and effectiveness of HIV response by promoting and strengthening the involvement of PLHIV by empowering and equipping them with skills to take them forward.

#### NSACS GIVES TRAINING ON HOME BASED CARE (HBC) FOR PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV (PLHIV) AND THEIR FAMILIES.

A two-days training on Home Based Care (HBC) for PLHIV and their family was organized by Nagaland State AIDS Control Society at Jalukie town on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of November, 2013, led by Mr. Tarepnokcha Jamir and Mr. Avilie Sekhose of NSACS. Stigma and discrimination being the root cause for PLHIV in not accessing health care facilities, it was felt that imparting training on Home Based Care would equip the PLHIV with the knowledge on how to treat common illnesses and infections at home, thus improving their health as well as reducing their burden on extra health care expenses. The training which was conducted in co-ordination with the District AIDS Prevention Control Unit (DAPCU) Peren and Network of Peren District People Living with HIV/AIDS (NPDP+). The training was the first of its kind to be conducted in Peren district and 29 PLHIVs from the district attended the program.



#### TRAINING OF COUNSELING **TECHNIQUES & SKILLS FOR COUNSELOR & ORW OF DICS.**

A two days training on Counseling Techniques and Skills for Counselor and ORWs of DICs was held on the 28th & 29th of May, 2013 at DUDA Guest house, Kohima. The training was attended by 37 participants. Resource persons were Ms. Athem Raman, Clinical Psychologist, SMHT, Ms. Medemmongla Jamir, PPTCT M&E Officer and Dr. Ngullie, Chairman, **KRIPA** Foundation.



#### Red Ribbon Clubs (RRC) Adolescent Education Programme (AEP) | Multi-Media Campaign - Music, Festivals & Sports.



The State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT) has rolled out the AEP for Class 5 - 8 since 2005 and Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has rolled out the AEP for Class 9 - 12 since 2007. Adapting/Integrating the NACO in the FY 2013-14, 220 teachers from Kiphire and Peren district were trained; covering a total of 52 schools - which includes both the Government and teachers (FBO) of different churches participated in the training. The teachers were trained in batch wise; where, Extra Assistant Commissioner (EAC), Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC), Chief Medical Officer (CMO), Doctors and subject specialists on 'Adolescent Health' were the resource persons (facilitators). The resource persons took up topics on Life skills education, Understanding Adolescents, Basic of HIV/AIDS, Gender and Gender roles, Substance Abuse, Teenage pregnancy and its consequences and the use of Question box

A music campaign was conducted covering the 11 Districts of Nagaland with the key message "Zero New Infections, Zero Discriminations and Zero AIDS Related Deaths." This was targeted to the urban youth.



Wisc Task Force, Government of Nagaland and LFA were the Chief Patrons. NSACS along with the event management team and DAPCU spearheaded social mobilization. Support and involvement of the RRCs, Drug Users' Network, office of the CMO, Faith Based Organization, the District Administration and partner NGOs played a key role in successfully implementing the campaign.

More than 20,000 youths were reached during the music campaign. The brand ambassadors - Clueless Attention, Winner of 2012 Music Campaign along with the road crew and NSACS staff, visited 16 educational institutions sharing the message of prevention, testing for HIV and against stigma and discrimination. More than 50 youth tested for HIV on the spot. 98 bands from across Nagaland auditioned for the title of "Red Ribbon Superstar."

Motivational Speakers from the District Drug Users Network were the main highlight of all the events in the Districts. Their testimonies were well received and created a positive impact to the audience. RRCs and partner NGOs in the Districts served as volunteers in all the events. IEC materials were distributed and red ribbons were pinned on all the people who attended the shows while HIV related posters were placed in and around the audition venues. District specific HIV related facts and figures, message on the theme were incorporated in the advertisements, during the district audition period.

#### INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST DRUG ABUSE & ILLICIT TRAFFICKING



Commenting on the contribution of Rs. 1 lakh per annum by each elected members from LADP fund, he said that it was a sign of "political will" and that the contribution was just a beginning. Ms. Ayieno Kechu, DD, (IEC) gave a presentation on the programs, activities and services available under NSACS and Mr. Tarepnokcha Jamir, GIPA Coordinator gave a brief overview on the topic of GIPA.

#### ADVOCACY WITH MEDIA PERSONS

The Advocacy & Sensitization program with the media persons was attended by journalists, representing English and local dialect newspaper organizations in Nagaland. The major action points conceived from the program were; to monthly feature the district wise HIV Scenario of the State, to report correct information about HIV & AIDS (events and news), and to write more articles and features about the services availability (HIV and AIDS) in the state.

#### CONSULTATION WITH BLOCK DEVELOPMENT OFFICERS (BDOS)

With the objectives to connect the developmental strategies and make the available programs & schemes accessible to the PLHIV/A and MARPs at block levels, a one-day Advocacy & Consultation with BDOs on HIV mainstreaming was held. Dr. N. L. Changkija, then PD, NSACS delivered the welcome address. The session on HIV/AIDS Scenario in Nagaland & Interventions in the Districts was taken by Ms. Ayieno Kechu DD (IEC). A session on- overview of schemes under Rural Development Department was briefed by Mrs. Jenny Kath, RDO, RD. Mr. Tarepnokcha Jamir, GIPA Coordinator, shared on the visions of NSACS in mainstreaming with various departments in our State, An Overview of National Rural Livelihood Mission was shared by Mr. M.Rollan Lotha, SPM, and NRLM. The action points drawn from the program were: Induction of Mission Director, NRLM in the NSACS' Executive Committee and Project Director (DRDA) in the DAPCC to facilitate NACP and NRLM convergence; workshop on HIV & AIDS for RD Directorate Officers and staff; a concrete plan to be developed for interventions in Blocks uncovered by TI Projects. While developing the plan high HIV prevalent Blocks to be included and represented by BDOs at the consultation for sensitization of VDBs on HIV & AIDS; regular consultation and coordination meeting with NRLM team to facilitate convergence with NACP.

#### SENSITIZATION FOR JAIL HEALTH CARE PERSONNEL & INMATES

- 30 AUGUST, 18 & 19 SEPTEMBER, 2013 | DISTRICT JAILS | KOHIMA, MOKOKCHUNG & TUENSANG

Sensitization workshop for Jail Health Care Personnel & Inmates was organized and conducted by NSACS in four districts jail: Kohima on the 30th of August, Mokokchung on the 18th of September and Tuensang on the 19th of September, 2013. The program was followed by voluntary testing, facilitated by the Mobile ICTC team. A total of 156 jail inmates and others were sensitized on HIV and AIDS and 7 inmates were tested for HIV.

#### TRAINING AT TUENSANG

5 NOVEMBER, 2013 | 5 TUENSANG VILLAGES

Training cum sensitization program on Basics of HIV & AIDS, PPTCT & Home Based Care in Noklak area was conducted based on the evidence and instances of recent AIDS related deaths. It was also noticed that after closing down of Community Care Centre in Noklak area, more HIV cases have been detected. Also, there was an increased rate of teenage pregnancy; creating a serious threat to HIV transmission. Therefore, the training was conducted in 5 villages: Choklangan, Sanglao, Kengniu, and Nokhu Village A & B. More than 1000 villagers attended the programs; comprising church leaders & members, Village Council members, and Gaon Buras. The sessions were taken consecutively by NSACS officials Ms. Chongkoi Khaming, Mr. Tarepnokcha Jamir and Ms. Shongmao, TI Cousellor, Noklak; and Mr. Pathong, ORW, Noklak.

#### SENSITIZATION FOR BARBERS OF KOHIMA

5 NOVEMBER, 2013 | LCS BUILDING | KOHIMA -

A one-day sensitization workshop for the barbers of Kohima district was organised and conducted jointly by NSACS and Kohima Municipal Council (KMC). A total of 91 Barbers were sensitized. The resource persons for the programme were Mr. Lanu from Kekhrie Foundation on "Basics of HIV/AIDS, STI & Condoms", Ms. Victoria, Counsellor Naga Hospital on "Importance of Blood Testing and Services available, NSACS & NRHM".and Ms. Yhuni, President Kohima Network of People Living with HIV/AIDS (KNP+) on "Stigma and Discrimination".

#### SENSITIZATION FOR BARBERS OF DIMAPUR

A one-day sensitization workshop for the barbers of Dimapur was organized at Chapel Hall, Civil Hospital, Dimapur. This workshop was jointly organized by Dimapur Municipal Council (DMC) and NSACS and a total of 88 barbers attended the program.

#### IPC CAMPAIGN WITH WOMEN GROUPS

SEP 2013 - FEB 2014 | 62 VILLAGES | NAGALAND

As part of reaching out to the rural areas, Inter-Personal Communication (IPC) with Kyong Eloe Hoho, Konyak Nyupuh Sheko Khong (KNSK) and Yimchunger Women Organization was conducted by NSACS. After giving training for 3 days to 25 women leaders under each organization, the leaders covered 62 media dark villages in their respective regions reaching out to 2548 people directly. IEC toolkits and materials were translated into local dialects, and flexes (with messages of mode of transmission, prevention and myths & misconceptions) were displayed in prominent places in the villages covered. The IPC Campaign also facilitates the identification of a pool of resource team within the community for sustainability.

#### TRAINING OF POLICE PERSONNEL IN NAGALAND

Training of police personnel on HIV & AIDS in Nagaland was a joint initiative of NSACS, PHQ, Project Orchid (EHA), AIHI, UNDP and LFA-UNAIDS with shared responsibility to sustainably engage police force in HIV prevention while addressing their vulnerability to HIV. One-day training programmes for the 1st NAP Bn., 13th NAP (IR) Bn., 15th NAP (IR) Mahilas Bn., and DEF/SP (Dimapur) in Dimapur district were conducted. 19 trainings were conducted covering 1787 police personnel. Training scheduled were planned according to the availability of police personnel in a given Unit and two trainings were conducted in a given with concurrent sessions.




